Situated in the heart of Prince George's County in the center of the Baltimore-Washington-Annapolis region, Bowie State University is one of the most prominent historic icons in the county and is the oldest historically black institution in Maryland. Serving students who come from diverse academic and socioeconomic backgrounds, Bowie State University provides high-caliber, accessible and affordable educational opportunities at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Prince George's County presents the best of both worlds with a diverse population and geographic composition, including a beautiful natural landscape of parks and fields surrounding Bowie State's campus, in addition to Bowie Town Center a few miles south with a shopping mall and an array of restaurants.

Nearby Old Town Bowie is the historic heart of the city of Bowie and boasts a number of captivating museums, quaint shopping and a community center just around the corner from the university.

Even in the current economy, Bowie State University continues to offer affordable tuition. The university was recognized as one of America's Top 10 Best Value Public Universities by Parents and Colleges magazine for 2010.

Bowie State recently added a doctoral program in applied computer science, making it the university's second doctoral program, in addition to the educational leadership doctoral program. The university also offers 20 master's programs and nearly a dozen graduate certificate programs, on top of 20 undergraduate programs. Academic programs are administered in four colleges including arts and sciences, business, education, and professional studies.

In addition to expanding academic programs, the university has been physically growing to meet increasing demands through construction projects. The university broke ground on a new \$79-million Fine and Performing Arts Center. The 123,000 square-foot building will include a 400-seat main theatre, a 200-seat black box theatre, a 200-seat recital hall, an art gallery, classrooms, class labs, and offices.

Bowie State University is a member of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association, an NCAA Division II conference. The BSU Bulldogs compete in 13 men's and women's sports, attracting thousands of fans to Bulldog Stadium throughout the year.

With close proximity to Washington, D.C. and Baltimore, Prince George's County offers a convenient location for students to pursue degrees at Bowie State University. The county has a multifaceted transportation system including a Marc train stop on campus, and three Metrobus line stops that connect to the D.C. Metro subway system. The Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport is also a short distance from the county.

The foundation of the university's success is a team of dedicated staff, a diverse student body and exceptional faculty members. Bowie State University will continue to thrive as an integral part of the Prince George's County experience for decades to come.
