For the past thirty plus years, Dr. Norton has blended clinical practice with teaching. Currently, he has taught full time at Bowie State University (BSU) for the past 14 years. During the 1970s, he also taught part time at the University of Maryland in Europe for three years and then in Maryland. In 1978, he began to teach at Bowie State College part time in the Department of Psychology followed by teaching in the Department of Education's master's program in Counseling. From 1973 to 1993, he also worked full time as a clinical psychologist in hospitals. Jobs held in hospitals included being a Director of an American Psychological Association accredited doctoral clinical psychology internship, past chair of two (2) departments of psychology, and past clinical director of an inpatient alcohol/drug program. He remains active in the community as a senior board examiner for psychologists seeking the American Board of Professional Psychology (ABPP) certification and been a licensed psychologist to practice since 1980. Consultant work is also done for a number of agencies on substance abuse to include George Washington University and Johns Hopkins University's Department of Community Psychiatry. Further, Dr. Norton developed the master's program in Mental Health Counseling and the Certificate in Addictions Counseling at BSU.
