#1	Adobe: Transformative Digital Teaching and Learning for All Students and Faculty (Hyflex Session)

Description:	This session demonstrates how and why all faculty in all disciplines can leverage Adobe Creative Cloud to transform teaching and learning across the curriculum for all students. We begin by demonstrating low-lift, high-impact approaches to experiential learning, and then share a wide array of digital teaching practices that scaffold from simple but powerful starting points. We will also explore how transformative digital teaching practices can promote inclusivity for all kinds of learners.

Description:	In this session, internationally recognized thought leader Gary Schoeniger will discuss the entrepreneurial mindset as a powerful cognitive framework that has become essential for individuals, organizations, and communities. We will discuss why we must embed an entrepreneurial mindset throughout the university to adapt and thrive in our current world. In addition, faculty will develop a deeper understanding of the eight life lessons related to an entrepreneurial mindset by reviewing the Ice House Entrepreneurship Program via a high-level overview. Simultaneously, you will learn about the Entrepreneurial Learning Initiative (ELI) research into the entrepreneurial mindset and some best methods for the facilitation of these concepts.

#4	Interfaith: A Key to Global Awareness and Bowie Boldness (Hyflex Session)

Description:	The breakout morning session opens with a video and two dynamite guest speakers focusing on implementing Interfaith concepts in any course in any discipline. The afternoon session opens with a live dramatization addressing conflict between different races and beliefs. Students need to know how to build and leverage social capital. Students need to be able to demonstrate how diversity strengthens our democracy. When faculty integrate Interfaith into their courses, students will understand how to construct their personal stories into inspiring personal narratives that address social issues. Interfaith skills and strategies equip students and others to thrive in the global economy. Interfaith cooperation is a required behavior and mindset for success for our students to lead in their respective disciplines. Attendees will learn more about Interfaith and workshop their syllabi to include Interfaith concepts which educate students on how to collaborate with diverse peers for social awareness and action in their immediate community and across the globe. Attendees will also experience a live dramatization featuring a faculty member, a pastor, and students who find themselves involved in conflict with people of diverse races and beliefs.
