

HBCU Education & the Freedom to **Read at American Education Week** Event



Dr. Darilyn Mercadel of the Department of Teaching Learning and Professional Development and Dr. Kim Evelyn of the Department of Language, Literature, and Cultural Studies were honored to participate in an American Education Week 2023 event hosted by BSU's Thurgood Marshall Library and the Friends of Historic Mt. Nebo Preservation Corporation, "Education in the 19th and 20th Century in Prince George's County: Reassess and Recommit." Coordinated by the library's Dean Sophia Sotilleo, the event featured historians, educators, and former students discussing the county's historic schoolhouses and 19th- and 20th-century efforts to improve access to education, particularly for Black children in the county. In their presentation, "Let Freedom Read," Dr. Mercadel and Dr. Evelyn discussed HBCU education, banned books, and the freedom to read as they considered the challenges 21st-century educators face and how to meet them in ways that best serve today's students.



## Unveiling Black Women's Resilience in the Post-War Era



Dr. Karen Cook Bell is editor of the forthcoming book Southern Black Women and Their Struggle for Freedom during the Civil War and Reconstruction (Cambridge University Press, Jan. 2024). The contributors to this volume each bring new perspectives to our understanding of how Black women navigated the turmoil of the Civil War and Reconstruction. There are nine chapters in this volume by historians Katherine Chilton, Felicia Jamison, Arlisha Norwood, Kaisha Esty, Crystal Feimster, Kelly Jones, Brandi Brimmer, Hilary Green, and Karen Cook Bell. Collectively, this edited volume underscores the diverse experiences of southern Black women across time and space in Washington, D.C., Virginia, North Carolina, Tennessee, Louisiana, Georgia, Alabama, and Arkansas. Dr. Karen Cook Bell has been appointed to the editorial board of the Journal of African American History and has been elected to the Executive Council of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH), the founders of Black History Month.

## From Microfilm to Legal History: BSU Student Uncovers Hidden Stories of Race Track Road

Ali Smith, a senior majoring in History and Government and a previous recipient of the Fannie Angelos scholarship, indexed more than 100 microfilm reels containing court opinions from the late 19th to the mid-20th century. However, the collection lacked a finding aid, making locating specific information challenging. In response to this challenge, Mr. Smith extracted metadata from the collection to create a public index, making the materials more accessible to researchers.

During his research, Ali stumbled upon an exciting case that involved illegal gambling near Bowie State University. The case, Lewis L. Brown v. U.S. (1929), involved a man who was prosecuted for operating a gambling site that focused on horse racing. The location of the illegal bets was the Bowie Race Track, which was just a few steps away from the university.

This case led Ali to explore the history of the university and the city of Bowie further, resulting in unexpected connections and historical insights. Mr. Smith emphasizes the valuable experience and knowledge gained through his internship.


## BSU Students Moderated Bowie City Council and Mayoral Candidates Forum



## The Effect Of Positive And Negative Covid-19 Announcements On The U.S. Stock Markets

On November 4th, the Human Resource Development Graduate Program held its annual symposium which focused on the Future of Work: Exploring AI in HR and Advancing Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging (DEIB).

Some key takeaways from this event include the notion that while AI is anticipated to replace a number of jobs on one hand, it is on the other hand set to create even more jobs. Additionally, participants were introduced to concepts such as 'Algorithm Biases' which can be evident in how AI responds to certain situations or demographics. Some proposed solutions to these biases is to have an AI application audit system which is all inclusive and also to invest in 'Ethical AI'. Attendees were left with some key concepts such as: 'Use AI, do not let AI use you'; 'AI is human intelligence in the absence of the human'; 'AI cannot replace human connection'.


## Journey Beyond Campus: Online Programs and Regional Higher Education Centers

Applicants may request up to \$8,000 in funds from the Bowie C2ARES Program.
