Rosalynne Whitaker-Heck, Ed.D., APR, has joined the Office of the Provost as the Associate Vice President for Retention and Student Success. She most recently served as the Associate Provost of Academic Affairs at Champlain College, a small, private, 4-year institution in Burlington, Vermont, with administrative leadership of the Center for Learning and Teaching, the Library, Academic Technology, Provost Office operations, and the Office of Academic Support and Coaching Services, in addition to co-leading a cross-institutional Student Success and Retention team.

Department of Fine & Performing Arts Professors Shine in Regional and National Exhibitions

The Department of Fine and Performing Arts (DFPA) Professors Art Vidrine and Gail Shaw-Clemmons were selected to exhibit art works in the 5th Biennial Maryland Regional Juried Art Exhibition at University of Maryland Global Campus (UMGC). The exhibition ran during the summer: Jun. 2 – Sept. 8, 2024. An exhibition catalog was produced for the show.

DFPA staff member Tracy Barwick and Professors Tewodross M. Williams, Art Vidrine, Kevin Holder, and Doreen Vernon were selected to participate in a Natural Alliance of Artists from Historically Black Colleges and Universities (NAAHBCU) juried art exhibition entitled Living the Legacy. The exhibition will also feature work by professors from Savannah State University. The show will run this fall, Oct. 14 – Nov. 9, in BSU's Fine and Performing Arts Center Gallery.

#### Department of Fine & Performing Arts Professors Shine in Regional and National Exhibitions

An interdisciplinary team of researchers including Prof. Gina Lewis (Associate Dean of the College of Arts & Sciences and Professor of Fine and Performing Arts), Dr. Monifa Love (Professor, Language, Literature, and Cultural Studies), Dr. Tamara Brown (Professor, History and Government), Dr. Carmen Walker (Associate Professor, History and Government), former BSU faculty member Dr. Sheneese Thompson (Howard University, Department of Afro-American Studies), and doctoral candidate Damita Green (Morgan State University) is investigating Carl and

Lilian Sandburg's relationship to the African American community and the Civil Rights Movement for the U.S. National Park Service's Carl Sandburg Home National Historic Site.

The team will review materials held by the National Park Service (NPS) and those in US special collections devoted to the Sandburg-Steichen family and provide its insights to the NPS. Co-PIs Lewis and Love and the team members aim to contribute to Sandburg scholarship as it relates to material culture, American poetry and politics, cultural influence, the Civil Rights Movement, Sandburg-Steichen activism, and representation of the Sandburgs in African American publications.

The two-year long project, Special History Study – The Sandburgs' Views and Roles Related to African Americans and Civil Rights, will culminate in a public sharing of findings as well as a final report for the NPS.

### **College of Education**

Dr. Jordan Alston Leads Discussions on Environmental Justice and Workforce Development



Dr. Masica Jordan Alston was a featured speaker at two prominent national conferences in September. At the 10th Environmental Justice Symposium at the University of Maryland, she led discussions on environmental harms faced by returning citizens in prison and their

transition to healthier communities. She also presented on clean energy workforce development, emphasizing inclusive pathways for marginalized groups. Both sessions centered on the theme of equitable workforce development as a means to justice and inclusion, with over 5,000 attendees amplifying the impact of these discussions.

At the National Institute of Justice (NIJ) Research Conference, Dr. Jordan shared a panel with presidential appointees and Harvard researchers, representing Bowie State University as the sole HBCU participant. Her presentation focused on culturally responsive training to reduce recidivism among justice-impacted individuals. Speaking at these competitive, high-profile events highlights her expertise in workforce development and justice reform, underscoring her leadership in advancing equity across sectors.

#### Reexamining Sociological Theory: A New Perspective from Dr. Parris



D. Elliott Parris, PhD, the Chair of the Department of Behavioral Sciences and Human Services, and former Interim Dean of the College of Professional Studies, has authored a new textbook on sociological theory, published by Cognella Academic Publishing of San Diego, California.

The book, entitled Confronting Sociological Theory, aims to bridge the gap between sociology and students from minority backgrounds, particularly those attending Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), as well as first-generation college students. The book reexamines sociological theory with a focus on making it relevant and accessible to these audiences. By highlighting the work of W.E.B. Dubois and other significant sociologists, it introduces students to the discipline's rich and varied perspectives, while also underscoring the implicit biases that have historically excluded minority contributors.

#### Thurgood Marshall Library is Now on Social Media!






#### Meet Laura Walker - Senior Analyst for Decision Support & Visual Analytics



The Path to Leadership: An HBCU's Unique Appeal for Black Professionals an International Summer Experience in Italy

Meet Temilade Ayo Aladeokin, a third-year Department of Educational Leadership doctoral student at the prestigious Bowie State University. For Mr. Aladeokin, the decision to pursue a doctoral degree in Educational Leadership and Administration at a Historically Black College or University (HBCU) is multifaceted. HBCUs offer distinct cultural, academic, and professional advantages that may not be readily found in predominantly white institutions.

Firstly, HBCUs provide a haven of cultural connection and belonging. Many Black students who have navigated the often-isolating terrain of white-dominated spaces find solace in the shared identity and understanding fostered within HBCU communities. This sense of belonging can be profoundly empowering for mid-career professionals seeking to develop their leadership potential within a culturally relevant context.

Furthermore, HBCUs boast a higher proportion of Black faculty members who serve as both mentors and role models. This representation matters, especially in the field of education, where Black leadership is historically underrepresented. Witnessing Black scholars excel in their fields can ignite a sense of aspiration and possibility in students, propelling them toward their own leadership goals. This is the case for Mr. Aladeokin, who expressly affirmed that having Dr. Ann Hilliard and Dr. Hyacinth Anucha as professors and mentors has helped him tremendously and greatly benefited his research efforts. "The acts of teaching that Drs. Hilliard and Anucha employ in and out of the classroom show that they are seasoned with a profound understanding of the foundational tenets that underpin effective leadership in education and that create a learning environment that is not only intellectually stimulating but also deeply respectful of diverse perspectives and experiences," says Mr. Aladeokin.

## STUDENT SUCCESS

In July 2024, Mr. Aladeokin took Bowie State University to Pisa, located in the Tuscany region of Italy, a city renowned worldwide for its Leaning Tower, for a summer school on Leveraging Ecological Economics to Advance the Sustainability Transition. With the concept of community wealth building (CWB) emerging as a promising approach to counter globalization and neoliberalism's negative economic and social impacts, CWB seeks to shift power and resources back into communities, promoting local ownership and democratic control over economic assets.

As major employers and producers of goods and services, universities are increasingly recognized as "anchor institutions" with the potential to leverage their resources and influence to foster local economic resilience. The summer school, which took place at the University of Pisa in Italy, taught Mr. Aladeokin about enhanced expertise in sustainable development in education and exposed him to leading-edge thinking and research skills to help him with his dissertation titled: Fostering Local Economic Resilience through Community Wealth Building Using Universities as Anchor Institutions.

Mr. Aladeokin believes that as Bowie State University aspires to be a Research II Institution according to the Carnegie Classification System, there is a need for more collaboration between faculty and students to strengthen the University's capacity for research.

#### Du Bois Center Awarded Grant to Study Free Black Communities in the Shenandoah Valley



Dr. Karen Cook Bell, Director of the BSU Du Bois Center for the Study of the Black Experience (CSBE), and Dr. Festus Cole, Co-Director of the Du Bois Center, received a \$63,426 grant from the National Park Service to conduct a study of free Black communities in the Shenandoah Valley in the years immediately preceding the Civil War and into the Reconstruction Era/Post-Reconstruction Era (1860-1900). The NPS study will focus on free Black women and men who lived and worked in the Shenandoah Valley at Cedar Creek and Belle Grove, Virginia.

#### Leading Author of Two Recent Books





#### Bowie State University Autonomous Technologies Lab (BSU@Lab) Robotics Infrastructure and Systems Enhancement

The BSU Autonomous Technologies Lab (BSU@lab) at Bowie State University has received \$788,250 in funding through DoD's Equipment/Instrumentation program to acquire a range of state-of-the-art robotic systems, including a legged robot equipped with a six-degree-of-freedom arm, twenty smaller robots, and five drones, each complete with sensor payloads and supplementary accessories. Our long-term goal is to develop software to enable these robots to autonomously gather situational awareness and conduct field operations

independently and collectively for extended durations in contested settings.

The specific equipment includes the Boston Dynamics' legged robot - Spot, Modal AI's VOXL 2 Development drone - Sentinel, and Quanser's educational robots - QCar, QBot, and QArm Mini. These cutting-edge systems are designed to collect multi-modal data, navigate complex terrains, and carry payloads, enabling advanced research in machine learning, perception, reasoning, and agent behaviors. To safely operate the drones indoors and outdoors, we also plan to procure TentCraft Pop-up Netted Drone cages. With the introduction of these equipment, we aim to transition our ongoing research into real-world applications, facilitating real-time data collection across various modalities, employing adaptive behavior techniques to address anomalies, and innovating novel approaches for target search and surveillance in intricate and unfamiliar terrains.

In addition to their pivotal role in advancing our research objectives, these robotic systems, along with their digital twins and dedicated studio labs, will serve as invaluable resources to enhance the training and education of students within our institution. Moreover, we envision these robots as

catalysts for fostering interest and participation in STEM fields, particularly among underrepresented minority students. Through K-12 outreach programs and collaborations with the community, we aim to engage and inspire young minds to explore the exciting realms of robotics-related STEM disciplines. By doing so, we aim to nurture a diverse and inclusive generation of future scientists and engineers, empowering them to pursue careers that will shape the future of robotics and technology.

Dr. Latifa Zoulagh, in the Department of Languague, Literature, and Cultural Studies, chaired the Women in French panel. In her presentation, titled " L'Histoire sort de la bouche des femmes: quand la femme écrit l'histoire," drawing from various texts, she explored the intersection of women's writing and history. The essay examined how women authors have used literature to challenge societal norms, document their experiences, and shape historical narratives.

She states, "Black businesses are the fastest growing population of new ventures in America, but struggle with sustainability and high growth. Understanding how to support more of these firms and BSU entrepreneurial students to achieve success is vital."  Bowie Business Innovation Center (BIC) working with Dr. Lawrence Potter, Dr. Matthew Crosston, Dr. Jared Moffett, and Ms. Sara Ibrahim to develop an online certificate of completion that aims to provide HBCUs and other minority-focused educational and non-profit organizations with knowledge and skills to be more competitive in the

governmental grant/contracting space.

- Created Blackboard Ultra Faculty Training workshops, including Designing Online Course Content and Using AI in Blackboard Ultra. Additionally, reviewing courses based on faculty feedback, while also working one-on-one with faculty members to enhance their syllabi and rubrics.
- Started generating automatic reports through Anthology Illumination for the seven core essentials and tracking student performance based on faculty requests.
- Collaborating with the Educational Leadership program to continue the process of dynamic learning in new course designs.
- Working with lead faculty on redesigning the Project Management Certificate courses, shifting them entirely into the new Blackboard Ultra format.

This coming academic year will see the arrival and engagement of three impressive E-i-Rs, covering everything from teaching classes, running a speaker series, and developing new entrepreneurial financing avenues for the ELLC.
