

Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) Quarterly report for Bowie State University as of 9/30/2021

- 1) Bowie State University signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- 2) As of 9/30/2021 a total of \$3.298M was received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1).
- 3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of 9/30/2021 was \$2,193,301.52.
- 4) The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs is 6,290.
- 5) The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs is 1332.
- 6) The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs was based on summer course loads.
 - Financial Aid applied funds to assist with summer 21 to students who completed the BSU summer application by the designated deadline resulting in funds for one three-credit course being offered to help the student.

- Funds were used to assist with the cost of tuition and fees for students for the fall 21 semester, utilizing an EFC cut-off. Allocation was based on the cost of in-state tuition minus any free money the student received.
- Funds were used to assist students with housing charges for fall 21. After all free money was considered, students with housing balances were awarded the difference to help cover the housing bill.

7) Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants:

- Students were instructed to accept or decline the summer funds and funds used to assist with tuition and fees.
