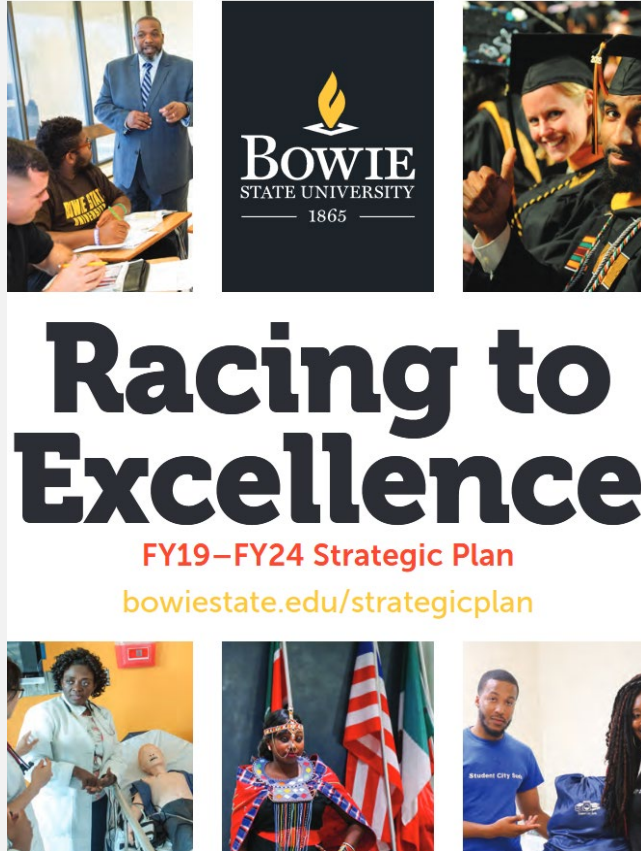

BSU Achievement Highlights

BSU Achievement Highlights



- BSU ranked #11 among more than 100 HBCUs by *U.S. News & World Report*.
- Gold Designation Military Friendly University for the past six years.
- 381 undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students received diplomas during the Winter Commencement.
- The Nursing Department's NCLEX pass rate from the 2023-2024 school year was 85.71% with 24 of 28 students taking the exam. 5 students from the Spring 2024 semester which will be included in the Maryland Board of Nursing's 2024-2025 report.
- 33 new academic programs since 2019.
- 80 grant submissions involving 41 different faculty members from March to December 2024.
- Grant and contract awards increased from \$5.1M in 2020 to \$15.9M in 2024 (313% in five years).
- Global educational experiential learning programs in Barcelona, Costa Rica, Ghana, Great Britain, Kenya, Nigeria, Sint Maarten, South Africa.
- Advancing entrepreneurial mindset through Entrepreneurship Innovation Center; Saxby's Experiential Learning program; Entrepreneurship Concentration, ELLC; and Bowie BIC.
- 32 students enrolled in BSU's prison education program at Jessup Correctional Institution. 17 freshmen, 9 sophomores and 6 juniors who could potentially graduate in 2025. Two students are eligible for parole.

Bowie State Grant Awards



- The EIC was awarded the 2024 Highly Commended Award in the Emerging Entrepreneurship Centers Category at the Global Consortium for Entrepreneurship Centers (GCEC). This distinction showcases centers with early signs of success and potential for long-term growth.
- BSU awarded a \$500,000 grant through the Maryland E-Innovation Initiative Fund (MEIF) to continue support for the endowed chair of Cyber Entrepreneurship and director of the Center for Cybersecurity and Emerging Technologies in the Computer Science Department. The award provides \$50,000 over a 5-year period.
- Bowie State was awarded a New Nursing Faculty Fellowship from the Nurse Support Program II funded through the Health Services Cost Review Commission and administered by the Maryland Higher Education Commission. The program increases the educational capacity of nursing programs and the number of nursing faculty in Maryland nursing programs.



Bowie State Grant Awards



- BSU received a \$400,000 grant from the National Science Foundation designed to increase AI usage and inclusivity among historically underrepresented groups.
- Mr. Jabari Walker received two grants from the Maryland Energy Administration to plan, design, and build a \$22M campus-wide microgrid. He received \$100,000 for the design and planning study as part of Phase I. BSU has been granted \$1.05M from MEA to move to Phase II of the construction planning.
- Bowie State's Autonomous Technologies Lab, led by Dr. Darsana Josyula, received a new round of funding totaling \$788,20 through the Department of Defense's equipment/instrumentation program to acquire cutting-edge robotic systems that will be used to develop software to conduct search and rescue field operations independently in dynamic settings. The addition will transform BSU's Autonomous Technologies Lab into a premier space for AI education, training, and research.
- The student team from the Department of Computer Science won first place at the 2024 NASA MITTIC Competition with the development a prototype to address computer vision syndrome, the eye strain caused by prolonged screen use. Team members Ashanti Boone, Chukwuemeka B. Obizuo, Dior Whitfield, Hanna Salim, Juliana Pianim, and Oluwabukunmi David Jaiyeola earned the grand prize of \$20,000 and a VIP trip to the MITTIC Accelerator.

Thurgood Marshall Library and Academic Commons

The recommended funding schedule will allow the planning/design to begin in July 2025 if Part II Facilities program is approved. The planning funds are distributed through FY2028 and into FY2029 with construction funding beginning in FY2029. This is a \$246M project. The new building will be 185,000 sq. ft. and will replace the current Thurgood Marshall Library that was built in 1977. It will be a modern, state-of-the-art academic hub that will support growth and new academic programs.

Gov. Moore has put this project into the budget for FY2026.

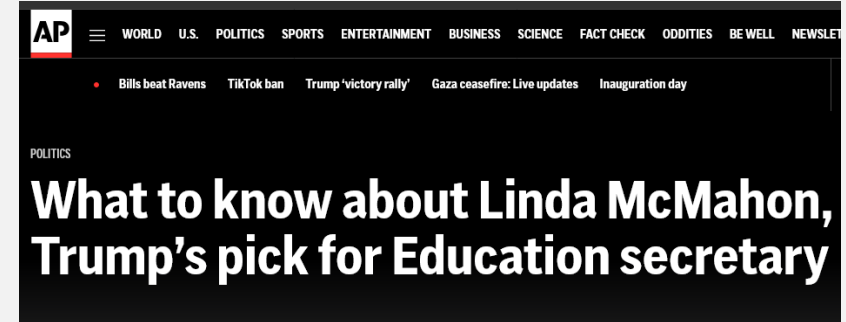

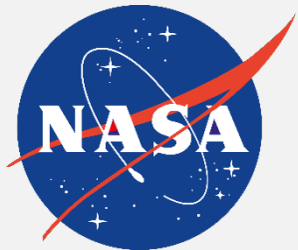
