1. There were no gender differences in attitudes toward developing wheelchair sports at Bowie State. X2(2) = 3.96, p = .138

2. There was no difference in religious practice and attitudes towards developing wheelchair sports at Bowie State. X2 (6) = 0.641, p = 0.378

3. Age was not a factor in attitudes towards developing wheelchair sports at Bowie State. t(34) = 0.37, p = 0.710
