Hypotheses

- 1. The first hypothesis is that alcohol abuse is more common in male athletes than female athletes.
- 2. The second hypothesis is that alcohol abuse is more common in college athletes than regular college students.

Participants

- ❖ 44 students
- ❖ 30 Women/ 14 Men
- ❖ Average age= 23.62
- Race
 - African American (N= 40)
 - Latino (N=2)
 - Native American (N=1)
 - Biracial (N=1)





Results

- 1. The first hypothesis is that alcohol abuse is more common in male athletes than female athletes. t(42) = 2.03, p = 0.049 Signficant
- 2. The second hypothesis is that alcohol abuse is more common in college athletes than regular college students. t(42) = 0.00, p = 1.00 Not Signficant

Discussion

- Athletes drink less alcohol than nonathletes
- There were no gender differences in drinking.
