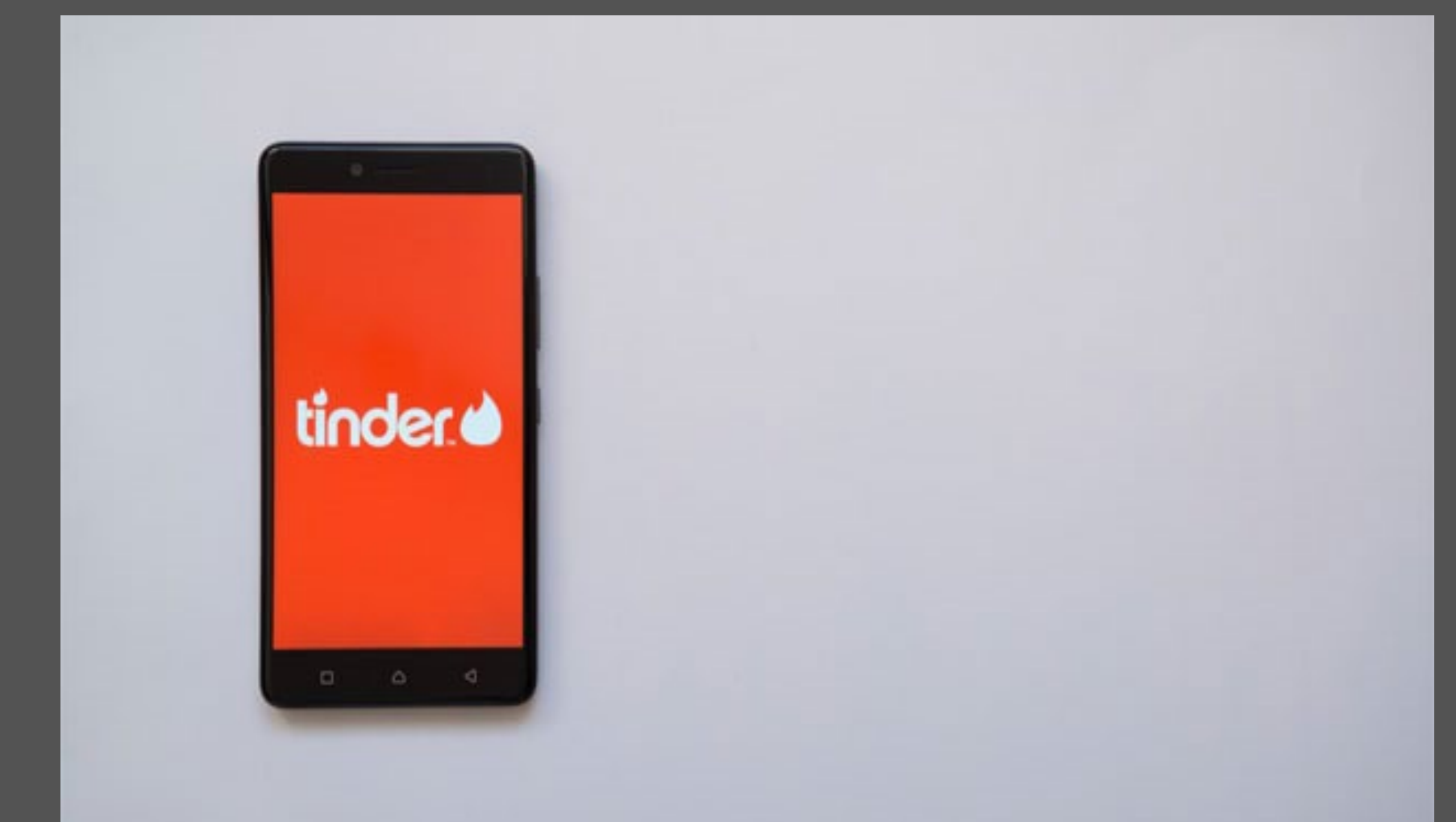
HYPOTHESES

The hypothesis is that college males are more likely to be on a dating website than college females.



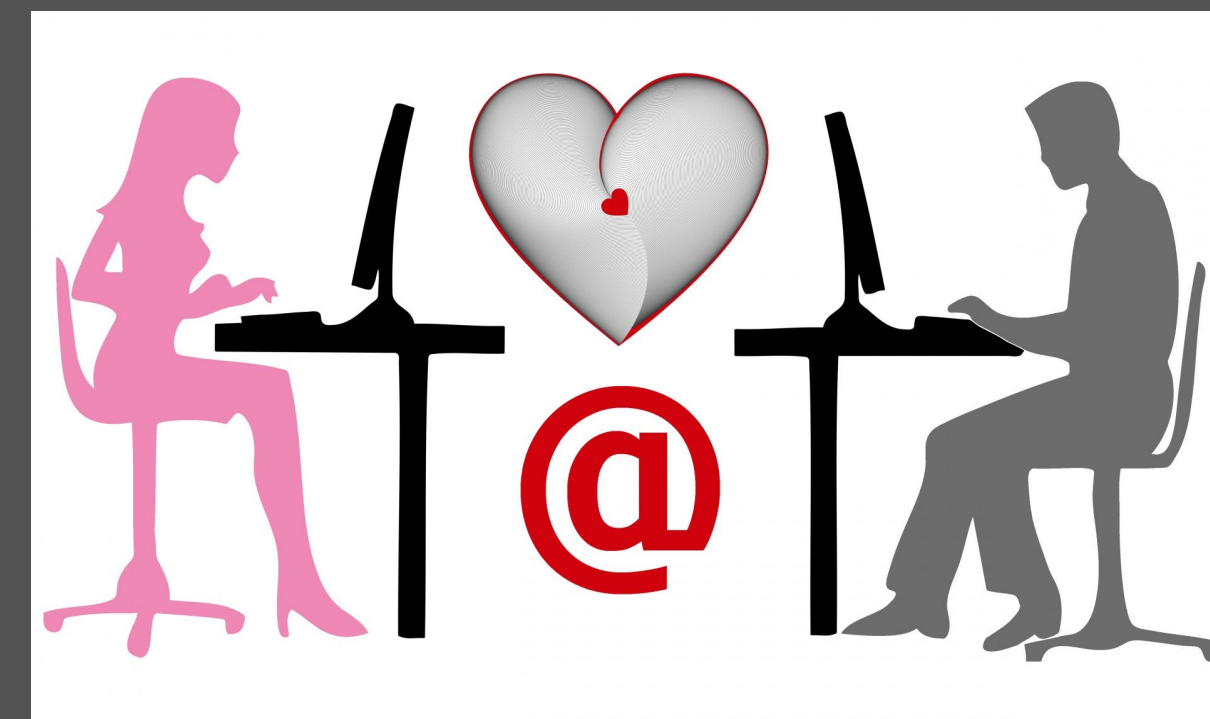
RESULTS

College students and Dating Applications
 $\chi^2 (1) = .003, p = .953$; showing not significant.



PARTICIPANTS

- ❖ 44 Students
- ❖ 30 Females/14 Males
- ❖ Average Age = 22
- ❖ Race
 - ❖ African American (N = 40, 90.9%),
 - ❖ White, (N = 0),
 - ❖ Latino (N = 2),
 - ❖ Asian (N = 0),
 - ❖ Native American, and (N = 1) and
 - ❖ One participant indicated their race as Other.



MEASURES

- ❖ Gender was used as a means of measurement
- ❖ Participants were asked their dating preference i.e hook-up, serious, or casual relationship.
- ❖ College students were asked if they're active on dating websites and how many.

DISCUSSION

The results of this study suggest the following:

- ❖ College males are not more likely than college females to be on dating applications.
