- 30 Females/14 Males
- *Average Age = 22
- *Race
 - *African American (N = 40, 90.9%),
 - **♦ White, (N=0),**
 - **☆Latino (N = 2),**


 - ❖Native American, and (N = 1) and
 - One participant indicated their race as Other.

MEASURES

- Gender was used as a means of measurement
- Participants were asked their dating preference i.e hook-up, serious, or casual relationship.
- College students were asked if they're active on dating websites and how many.

RESULTS

College students and Dating Applications $X^2(1) = .003$, p=.953; showing not significant.



DISCUSSION
