Hypothesis

Views toward male batters of domestic violence are more tense than views towards female batters.

-Discrimination at the hands of the police has an impact on whether people hold a lighter accountability to women who commit domestic violence.

Measures

- Knownbrut (yes=1, no=0)
- ❖ Totdvman (yes=24, no=8
- ❖ Totdvwoman (yes=24, no=8)



Results

- 1. Have you known someone personally who experienced police brutality and myths about male batters
- r(30) = -.199, p = 843
- 2. Have you known someone personally who experienced police brutality and myths about female batters
- r(30) = 2.40, p = .022

Discussion

The results of this study suggest the following:

- People who have experienced discrimination/brutality at the hands of the police have significantly higher scores on th Domestic Violence myth scale about women.
- People who have experienced discrimination/brutality at the hands of the police has no impact on the scores on the Domestic Violence myth scale about men.
