Trap (Drill Music): The impact Trap Music Has On Youth In Connection to Violent Crimes

<u>Hypothesis</u>

1. Young adults are more likely to engage in criminal or deviant behavior after listening to trap music consistently as it the culture .

Participants

- 35 participants
- 24 females/10 males
- Race
- African-American (N=28)
- Multiracial (N=3)
- Latino (N=1)
- One participant didn't answer the question about their race
- One participant indicated their race as other

Measures

- Hip Hop music was assessed by asking simple closed-ended questions
- The questions was to explore if college students listen to Hip Hop music after an emotional day or by themselves



<u>Results</u>

Hip Hop music, r=.779, p=.01; significant for those who listen to hip hop music

Discussion

The results of this study suggest the following:

- Most recent research suggest correlation between violin crimes, offenders age and music culture

- The results showed that exposure to media violence had a statistically significant association with aggression and violence amongst youth
