
## Abortion Stance and Religious Views

#### HYPOTHESES


1. Our hypothesis is that the more the person attended church the less likely they will be proabortion.

Religiousness/abortion rights stance r=-.31 p=.023



#### PARTICIPANTS

- •54 Students
- •49 Women/5 Men
- •Average age = 22
- •Race

African American( N = 51)
Latino(a) (N = 1)
Asian (N = 1)
Middle Eastern (N = 1)



### MEASURES



- Spirituality (yes=2, somewhat=1,no=0)
- Church attendance(Frequently=3, occasionally=2, holidays only=1, never-0)
- Pro abortion (Strongly agree=3, agree=2, disagree=1, strongly disagree=0)

#### DISCUSSION

The results from this study suggest the following:

- The more spiritual and the more the person attend church the least likely they were to be in favor of abortion.
- Limitations we experienced was the pandemic, limited amount of questions we could ask on the survey and how we collected the data
- Strengths were that we were assisted with creating survey, received timely responses and data was complied for us.
