



Transfer Articulation Agreement between Borough of Manhattan Community College and Bowie State University

Effective January 27, 2025

This transfer articulation agreement between the Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) located at The City University of New York, 199 Chambers Street, New York, NY 10007, and Bowie State University (BSU), a constituent institution of the University System of Maryland, an agency and instrumentality of the State of Maryland, located at 14000 Jericho Park Rd, Bowies, MD 20715, concerns associate degrees for transfer and the continued seamless transfer of BMCC students to Bowie State University. This MOU is effective between the Borough of Manhattan Community College and Bowie State University as of the date executed by authorized representatives of both parties.

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to establish the terms under which Bowie State University will guarantee admission, ensure acceptance of prior coursework, and facilitate the transfer of BMCC students who have completed an Associate Degree in a major similar to a major at Bowie State University. This agreement supersedes any prior agreement between the parties.

Bowie State University and Borough of Manhattan Community College agree to the following:

I. Admission

Bowie State University will extend a guaranteed admission to all Borough of Manhattan Community College students who have successfully graduated from BMCC with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree in a specific program as identified in the appendix, prior to enrollment at the University, and have met Bowie State University's additional institutional requirements, if any, as expressly identified in subsequent section of this articulation

agreement. Bowie State University's guarantee of admission shall be effective upon execution of this Agreement.

II. Transferability of Credit

With respect to transfer students wishing to complete their education at Bowie State University, for credits taken and accepted by BMCC, a maximum of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units will be transferable to Bowie State University and core courses will align to the major pathway deemed similar, provided the student received a passing grade/grade equivalent to a C or better in the applicable major course (with the exception of licensure programs or state requirements where a grade of B or better may be required).

Course grades that are superseded on a transcript by a higher-grade following repetition of the course shall not be considered in calculating a transfer student's GPA.

III. General Education Requirements

With respect to transfer students wishing to complete their education at Bowie State University, Bowie State University agrees to apply to its lower division general education requirements credits earned with a grade of C or better in accordance with Maryland Regulations credits.

IV. Articulation

Borough of Manhattan Community College Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees will be articulated by Bowie State University at the degree level to comparable Bowie State University majors as outline in the Appendix. Bowie State University will publish transfer information for the Borough of Manhattan Community College transfer students. BMCC students awarded an Associate in Arts or Associate of Science program listed in the Appendix will enroll at Bowie State University at junior standing, and require no more than 60 additional semester units to complete a bachelor's degree within the similar program, as listed in the Appendix.

V. Financial Aid, Scholarships, and Tuition Reduction

Bowie State University will provide the most affordable access to BMCC students transferring via this agreement and will provide financial aid counseling regarding all financial aid options. Bowie State University will share information related to financial aid opportunities with the Borough of Manhattan Community College as part of its guidance and promotional materials.

Once a transfer student has been admitted to Bowie State University they are eligible to apply via the standalone scholarship application process to be considered for available private and merit scholarships. The application can be found at www.bowiestate.edu/scholarships and is open from February 15 - June 15 prior to the start of the Fall semester. ONLY students who apply during this timeframe will be considered for available scholarships. Completing an application does not constitute an automatic award; additionally, award amounts vary based on funding and student eligibility.

VI. Marketing and Communications

Bowie State University may include in its marketing and communications, including the use of toolkits, brochures, flyers, logos, customizable social media posts, and other resources developed by BMCC. Bowie State University will work in collaboration with BMCC to assist in the dissemination of information to students, faculty, and staff at BMCC to support and encourage transfer to Bowie State University. Borough of Manhattan Community College will inform students, faculty, and staff of the benefits of transfer to Bowie State University. Information will be encouraged through established internal and external BMCC communication channels (such as student and employee newsletters, website pages, social media and listservs).

Bowie State University and Borough of Manhattan Community College will co-promote the programs on their individual campus websites related articulation and transfer, marketing materials, social media and other communication channels, and other avenues to disseminate information to students, faculty, and staff. Depending on the availability of funds, Bowie State University may be included in other BMCC promotional campaigns and will submit any content to be included in a promotional campaign in a format and in a manner determined by BMCC.

The parties grant to each other a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use each other's trademarks and servicemarks in furtherance of the agreement's purposes, or to identify and communicate the existence of the agreement to students and alumni. Use of trademarks, servicemarks, and logos will comply with use policies of the originating institution. The parties shall discontinue the use of the licensed marks and return or destroy any and all files and materials containing the licensed marks supplied by the owner at termination or expiration of the agreement. Neither party grants to the other any interest in the other party's trademarks. Should either originating institution request, in writing, that a particular use of the originating institution's trademarks and/or servicemarks be discontinued, the non-originating institution shall cease and desist such use of the trademarks and/or servicemarks.

VII. Agreement Follow-Up Procedures:

a. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying agreement:

Neither party may change this agreement unilaterally. BMCC and Bowie State University shall make available to one another timely changes to their policies, respective degree programs and/or curriculum (i.e., admission, curriculum, and degree requirements, course numbers, course content and/or catalog or bulleting descriptions), in writing. Any changes to this agreement must be communicated to the other party\ and jointly agreed upon in consultation with the relevant officials of each institution. Any changes agreed upon must be signed, dated, and attached to this original agreement.

b. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Annually, Bowie State University will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

c. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and the Bowie State University website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students. This agreement is designed for students enrolled at BMCC who are interested in transferring to the following academic programs within Bowie State University.

VIII. IIX. Term and Termination

- a. This agreement shall be effective on the date that it is signed by the appropriate and authorized representatives of each Institution.
- b. Either Institution may, at its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement upon delivering Ninety [90] days' written notice to the other Institution and the Maryland Higher Education Commission.
- c. Both Institutions agree to meet once every two [2] year(s) to review the terms of this agreement.

IX. Amendment

- a. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the Institutions with respect to their rights and obligations in carrying out the terms of the Agreement and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous agreements or understandings.
- b. This Agreement may be modified only by written amendment executed by both Institutions.

X. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Maryland.

The Institutions are and shall remain in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local statutes, laws, ordinances, and regulations relating to this Agreement, as amended from time to time.

Neither party will make false, erroneous or misleading statements, representations, warranties or guarantees to its students, employees, or other third parties with respect to the other party. This agreement may be executed in several counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one single agreement.
