Responsibilities: Teaches undergraduate visual culture, art history, theory and criticism course in the Department of Fine and Performing Arts; conducts research and/or practices in the area of visual culture, art history, theory, criticism or other related field; and contributes to the BSU community through administrative duties and service to the department, college and/or university committees; works outside the classroom by advising students, attendance at department events, and keeps regular office hours. This is a full-time, tenure track faculty position.

Qualifications: A Ph.D. in Visual Culture, Art History, or a related field; or a Master's Degree in an arts professional field, with relevant experience in visual culture or art history, arts management, and museum and gallery management. Minimum 3 years of teaching experience in on the university level preferred. Demonstrated knowledge of pedagogy and teaching methodologies appropriate to undergraduate level students majoring in art disciplines, and/or those who are using the course as a general education requirement; knowledge of global art history from prehistoric through present day; knowledge of studio art processes, techniques and practices employed by artists; knowledge of appropriate classroom technology, to include the Learning Management System Blackboard. The ideal candidates will contribute to the diversity of the program by bringing a perspective, way of thinking, and/or a unique set of experiences that expand the intellectual conversation and artistic practices in the field.
