Responsibilities: The primary duties for this tenure-track position are teaching undergraduate art history, theory and criticism courses in the Department of Fine and Performing Arts; developing new courses to support Studio Art/VCDMA; providing curatorial and operational support to the BSU Gallery of Fine Art; supporting students in the development of their thesis concept, exhibition design, and understanding of its role within existing bodies of knowledge; collaborating with other members of the department in seeking grant funding and developing co-curricular programming; conducting research and/or practice in the area of art history, theory, criticism or other related field; contributing to the BSU community through administrative duties and services to the department, college and/or university committees. Responsibilities also include working outside the classroom by advising students, attendance at departmental events, and keeping regular office hours; ability to teach some studio courses preferred.

Qualifications: Doctoral degree in Art History, or a related discipline preferred. Masters in a related discipline with a minimum five (5) years of professional experience; three (3) years of teaching experience preferred. Demonstrated knowledge of pedagogy and teaching methodologies appropriate to undergraduate level students majoring in art disciplines, and who are using the course as a general education requirement; knowledge of global art history from prehistoric through present day; knowledge of African and African American art history; knowledge of studio art processes, techniques and practices employed by artists; knowledge of appropriate classroom technology, to include the Learning Management System Blackboard. The ideal candidate will contribute to the diversity of the program by bringing a perspective, way of thinking, and/or a unique set of experiences that expand the intellectual conversation and artistic practices in the field.

Condition of Employment: Willing to work outside normal business hours to support curricular, co-curricular and recruitment activities.
